1. PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

The secret to this year success on the field started with a review of the Club in mid season 2007. In taking over this role from Terry Scanlon both of us realized that a review of all operations was required – our first initiative was to interview all of the players. With some 42 interviews being conducted this process was instrumental in identifying new initiatives for season 2008.

The review identified many initiatives and included a range of issues such as:

- Providing more variety for pre-season training;
- Providing more specialist coaches
- Establishment of a recruiting committee;
- Establishment of a junior football club;
- Scholarship being granted to a St. Josephs College secondary school student to reinforce the ties between the Football Club and the College.
- Development of a social calendar ahead of the season to enable all players to plan for each social event.

This review concluded with the appointment of a new coaches, with Terry Scanlon (Senior Coach – returning to coaching after 26 years), John Rush (Reserves & Senior Assistant), Greg Barry (Club18) and Col Peasnall reappointed as U19.

The implementation of a recruiting committee, chaired by Michael Barker also proved very successful in identifying many new players. This resulted in the senior list being augmented by 10 new players including an assistant playing coach Matt Keown from Sandhurst. A further 10 players were also recruited to the reserves.

The recruitment to the coaching panel of John Noonan (ruck), Paul Kearney (forward), Steve Hibbert (on ball) and Mark Hannebery as specialist coaches proved that coaching is now no longer the domain of one person. The Club is indeed fortunate that these people offered their time without reward. This approach also proves that coaching of a senior team is a team affair and requires a more considered approach to coaching players, be it on fitness, skills, mental preparation or overcoming injury. These factors alone prove that it requires more than one “senior” coach to complete these tasks.

The coaching panel was also augmented with fitness coaches both during the pre-season (Jon Chappell) and throughout the remaining parts of the year with Brendan O’Sullivan. Preseason training commenced in November 10 at the Hockey Centre twice weekly with Jon Chappell as fitness coach, with “Boot Camp” sessions being conducted by “Paramount Fitness” on weekends. Attendance at even these early dates saw player participation in excess of 30 players per session, which was the best attendance ever for any form of pre-season training.

What this approach highlights is again the issue of what constitutes an appropriate approach to VAFA football.

As last years review identified the Club needed to take a more professional approach to the operation of the club. The term "amateur" only applies to the rules under which the Club plays and the name of the competition.

This professional attitude places an expectation on the commitment of the players to perform and attend training and to ensure injuries were treated effectively. All players demonstrated a committed attitude throughout the year without complaint and, this is a large part of why they were successful throughout the season.

Further this professional attitude also places a large commitment on finding revenue streams in order to address these issues, be it specialist coaches, additional trainers, medical facilities, gymnasium and the like. Really VAFA football now is only amateur in name and rules; the expectation from players in today's terms is that they expect a similar regime and professional approach similar to teams within the AFL/VFL competitions.

1.1 Season 2008

Top two finishes for all three senior sides has not been achieved before, whilst the U19's just missed out on finals and with the reserves winning a premiership capped off a successful year. The Seniors started out in great form by being undefeated for the first 10 games and holding onto top spot well into the second half of the draw. Injuries played a part in their lack of success during the later half of the year, but the depth from the reserves enabled them to hold onto second spot for the double chance. The lack of form however for the second half unfortunately did not auger well for the finals with the Senior side bowing out in straight sets to Bullen Templestowe (eventual Premier) and Old Geelong.

The Reserves started well for the first half of the year, staying in the top four, and then in the second half managed to defeat the top two sides in Fitzroy Reds and Old Geelong to finish on top. A heavy ground greeted them for the second semi final which suited the larger stronger Geelong side, which beat NOBSPC by 4 goals.

The following week against Old Mentone, the reserves played attacking football in the second half to have a small lead, which was extended during the last quarter into a strong 4 goal breeze to eventually win by 4 goals. The Grand Final however was a vastly different day with a fine and sunny day and hard ground ensured the running game of the NOBSPC could be displayed.

The crowd was impressed by the skill level of this game, equating this game to that usually displayed by a senior side. The strength of the larger Geelong side was not an advantage, with the fleet footed combination finishing the game by 38 points in front, winning the Clubs first Reserves Premiership since 1994. This side has the potential to win back to back premierships given their young average age of 21.

The Club18 side (second reserves side) also had a great year finishing second but bowing out in both finals. The decider preliminary final was played in driving rain with Old Carey defeating NOBSPC by 2 goals.

The U19 has a better year and welcomed Scholarship student Josh Minenko from St Josephs, the first college student since Tristan Joss. Josh unfortunately injured his knee at athletics in pre-season, which required a full re-construction. Josh however attended training after the operation and returned in the second half of the season. This achievement was phenomenal given that this could have been a season ending injury. The return was testament to Josh's desire to play and contribute to the success of the side and on return Josh kicked 11 goals in the last three games. The U19 were in and out of the four during the season and missed winning some crucial games, by less than a goal, which cost them a finals appearance.

Overall the "winning" feeling has returned to the Club, after the past 4 lean seasons. The refinement of the initiatives identified for 2007, will be completed again to ensure that next year all sides in the finals and endeavour to win that elusive Senior Premiership and to enable the Club to progress back through the VAFA Grades.

1.2 Junior Football Club

In terms of the establishment of a junior football Club, the Western Region League declined our application to field a side for season 2008. This will not stop the Club, as a new application will be made to field a side in the Yarra Valley Junior Football League. This initiative will enable an outlet for the 210 AusKick children that currently use the Gillon Oval on a Saturday morning to progress into junior football with the Club.

The Executive and representatives of Brunswick AusKick are meeting with the YJFL on 12 November to discuss our application.

1.3 Social events

The success on field also resulted in success off field with in excess of 800 people attending the following events:

- BirraBella - 60
- Ladies day - 135
- RACV Coterie luncheon - 70
- Auction Night - 190
- President's luncheons - 100
- Cocktail Night, Sth Melbourne - 120
- 5K draw - 60
- Presentation Night - 130

The attendance by supporters during home games was also well up on previous years, which is reflected in the takings for the canteen and bar.

Next year the social calendar will be set well in advance of season 2009 with respective committees established for each event. This will facilitate and assist in organizing each event. The Club is indebted to the efforts of Social Committee Chairman Scott Sleep, Chris Dobson and Matt Perry in preparing and organizing these events.

1.4 ClubsOnline

The implementation of ClubsOnline, through the efforts of past President Tony Duggan has now enabled a number of administrative issues to be resolved. The first being that the provision of an up to date list of all members and players has now been compiled. There were several lists of past and current members and the location in a central database enables all members to up date their contact details as required over the web and be informed of upcoming events. At present we have in excess of 450 on email, with less than 30 members still on postal.

This software also enabled the Club to provide short match reports (prepared by Team Managers) of each Saturdays results to all members by email on Monday. On Friday each member was reminded on the time and venue for each game. This effort was coordinated and completed by Tim Waters. Many members have commented that this was a great way to keep in contact with the fortunes of the respective sides and also enabled them to plan for upcoming games or events.

The amalgamation of all members onto one database has also enabled all past premiership players records to be updated. This facilitated a reunion this year at the Presidents Luncheon of the 1963 & 64 Premiership sides. Next year this approach will be again undertaken for the remaining premiership sides and administrations.

The other advantage of this software is that all members, sponsors, players can pay membership online and also entrance fees into social events. Although this was only the first year of operation, it is expected that payments online will continue to increase throughout 2009. The setup of this software, WEB site and its operation is in large part due to the expertise of Jayden Mallen; the Club thanks Jayden for the time and effort in implementing *ClubsOnline*.

1.5 Season 2009

Col Peasnell has decided to retire from coaching duties from the U19's for 2009. The Club wishes Col all the best over the coming years. Another retirement is that of Sam Chesire, who after 8 years without playing recommenced playing football in 2008 and achieved the 100 game milestone, playing in the seniors throughout the year. Sam has been appointed as Coach of the U19's for 2009.

All other coaching positions have also been confirmed, with the current coaches all being reappointed for next year.

1.6 Conclusion

The review of 2007 identified the *pieces of the jigsaw* that needed to be resolved to make the Club more competitive. The resolution of these issues and implementation of new initiatives combined with the effort by all players, coaches, members, sponsors resulted in a far more successful and competitive year or season 2008. It is however only the first year of implementation and with further refinement in our approach, I expect that next year the Club will achieve a greater level of success, both on and off the field.

The VAFA this year as part of the 150 year celebration of Australian Rules Football also provided a 150 game medallion to registered players who reached this milestone. The Club decided however to extend this to all players who played 150 games with the Club, with some 52 being identified. Of these players 22 received their 150 game medallions at the Coterie luncheon in May.

In recognition of our players the lockers within the change rooms now identify each player who has played more than 100 games and/or won a Best & Fairest. Each name by jumper number is now displayed on an individual locker.

6. COACHES REPORTS

6.1 *Senior Coach – Terry Scanlon*

After a review carried out by Trevor Ludeman and myself mid 2007, we decided that to reinvigorate the club we required to sort out the football department first. Due to my availability and having more time, I decided to take on the senior coaching job. With the help of many people, mainly past players, we were able to be much more competitive.

Preseason training began in mid November 2007 and was held at the National Hockey Centre before Christmas. This proved to be an attractive training venue due the surface of the hockey pitches and the proximity of it to the players work and study commitments. After Christmas we started training around the 21st January at Gillon oval and over the next two months we had a total of 173 people train at the club.

The season started with a good win against Fitzroy Reds and due to the efforts from our players to be committed to the preseason training we seemed to be fitter than our opposition. We were able to win 10 games straight and our only large margin was against the eventual premiers side, Bulleen Templestowe (76 points). All other games were won between 10 points and 30 points, which says to me that the competition was very even.

The second half of the season proved to be a challenge with some injuries to key players and our opposition sides working us out. The facts are we only won the two of our last ten games. We only had one game when we were beaten convincingly; all other losses were a close margin with strongly contested results. Despite this run of results we entered into the finals for the first time since 2001 and it was great to see the reserves win a premiership. In summary, the club had a very enjoyable year and we prove that with hard work we can be competitive again.

Thank you to all my many helpers, especially the assistant coaches and Trevor Fell (chairman of selectors), our team managers, Peter Clancy and Mal Cole and all the trainers for their great efforts and support. We have **unfinished business** and all of us have committed for the season 2009.

6.2 Reserves Coach – John Rush

Prior to any review the on field performance must be listed upfront.

On field results reflect both the tangible and current status of the club.

With the above said it is great pleasure I announce and thank that the Reserve XVIII are Premiers for Season 2008.

Having finished in 2nd position after the home and away season with 14 wins and 4 losses the premiers 'tag' is just reward to many at the club. However, while this achievement is a great result I know that all people associated with the club wish to see the senior team at the top of the tree and so Season 2009 is a great challenge for all players, people and teams to assist the club and for the senior team to reach for our desired result. Looking retrospectively -

- The reserve team had a 50 player 'churn rate' i.e. the total number of players who played at least 1 game for the reserves (and that includes John Murphy and myself). Ideally you would like to see about 55 players used through the reserves as injuries showed in all teams that we need a solid playing roster to be successful.
- Season 2008 provided a platform for reserve players to push their credentials into the senior team more than ever and while I can't quantify from previous seasons there was a total of 21 players who played in both the senior and reserve team this year.
- For the record I believe a total of 39 or 40 players played senior football this year. These numbers show that the club has depth within its ranks. But depth is no good without harmony.

That was the most pleasing aspect for the season. Anyone who played reserves this season played for their team-mates and not themselves and this resonated through the reserves the result speaks for itself. This harmony came about due to a number of factors including but not limited to a varied pre-season schedule that provided a fitness base, enthusiasm and a welcoming environment.

Together with an ensemble of off field support that stems from a stable and supportive committee and willingness for those involved in Season 2008 to work hard then better results were expected. I don't forget that a smidgen of luck can play its part too!

Looking forward to 2009 and beyond this is a great opportunity for the NOBSPC FC to grow on and off the field. There is no doubt we have all learnt something this year. The club feels like a great place to be and when you look at the reserve premiership team and consider that 33% of the team was 1st year players (Tom Alsop, Jason Weidner, Joel Scanlon, Chris Punton, Phil Doolan, Chris Horsley, Kieran O' Dwyer, Alex Johnson and Luke Fogarty) then you can see a platform for Season 2009. I believe these players will improve and have an opportunity for senior selection in 2009 that will strengthen the team unit.

From another end it was encouraging to see the likes of Paul Bryar and Kelvin Grace come through Club18 and play both reserves and seniors.

6.4 *Club XVIII - Greg Barry*

The Clubbies started off the year very well winning the first 3 games all by over 10 goals (Round 3 was 100+). Round 4 we lost to Marcellin at home by 2 goals which turned out to be their smallest winning margin of the year. Round 5 we had a great come from behind win in the rain against Old Carey in Bulleen. The lowest point of the Home & Away games were Round 7 & 8 where we lost to Kew and Marcellin by over 10 goals each. We were able to regroup from those loses and go on to lose only 1 more game for the season (by 2 points at Kew). We finished 2nd with a record of 11-4.

In the 2nd semi final against Marcellin at Gillon we were blown off the park. We were no match for them at any stage and in a very disappointing effort, only kicked 3 goals all day. In the Preliminary final against Old Carey at Elsternwick Park we again struggled to find any rhythm in terrible conditions; it rained all match and the ground was very heavy with much surface water. Unfortunately we only managed 2 goals for the game and lost by 3 goals. We can't really put our finger on a reason for our very disappointing finals campaign; maybe we had been up for too long and didn't have much to give come the finals, and/or not being able to keep a settled side on the park hurt us again.

A total of 65 players played Clubbies this year. In a perfect world that is too many. I don't think we had a week where there were less than 4 changes made. The Clubbies has always been a good tool for letting guys play who are really keen for a game and not up to playing at a higher standard; but even with that said, it is too much to handle virtually 3 teams worth of guys playing for the one side. A number of factors were the cause of this high number of players this year; Weddings, trips away, injury, retirements and reserves players having a game here and there. Doubtful that would happen again many times all in the same year.

I don't recommend a second Club 18 side being introduced by the club at this stage, but a repeat of high player numbers next season may force a rethink.

Issues and solutions:

- Having trainers at every game was very good and must be kept up;
- Need water boys at each game (injured/non selected players to help if able);
- Subs must be paid by Round 6 (select a person to be in charge/not coach or team manager if possible);
- Maybe train on a different night to the seniors to get more ground space, and/or call alternative training sessions at running tracks, pools, etc;
- Training taken twice a year by Senior coach or Senior players to make Clubbies feel more part of the club as a whole;
- Have board members address the side to give them updates on club events & feedback if happy with performances, etc;
- Make Thursday night dinners more attractive for players to attend by making it more relevant to each side (have look-a-likes & player interviews, etc. from all sides).

From a personal point of view, I would very much like to thank the football club for giving me the opportunity to coach the side this year. It was a great experience and taught me a lot, not only in a football sense but also people management skills which I have learnt is probably the most important part of coaching in the modern game.

8. FINANCIAL REPORT – SEASON 2008

On behalf of the Committee of NOBSPC, the financial report for Season 2008 is presented to the members for your consideration and approval.

Overall Summary

From a profit perspective, the year ended 30 September 2008 has seen a vast improvement despite a loss of \$5,644 being returned. This is up from a loss of \$11,758 in the 2007 year. However, the club still has outstanding debts amounting to \$40,216 which predominantly relate to outstanding invoices at year end which have been paid as at current date.

Closing bank balance at 30 September 2008 is \$19,176.

Results of Operations

The table below identifies all areas within the Profit and Loss Statement and gives a clear analysis of the performance for the year ended 30 September 2008.

Memberships

The collection of memberships was relatively similar to 2007. The increase in revenue is mainly due to the increased membership fee. Collection of memberships is still an issue and needs to be addressed so that improvements are made in the future.

This will be one of many areas of significant focus for the Treasury committee in the 2008/2009 season. Systems are currently being determined to rectify these issues and will be implemented in due course. Clubs online has been a good addition in 2007/2008, however to make the most of the system the Treasury committee will be pushing for the majority of transactions to be made online in 2008/2009.

Sponsorships

Sponsorship has been the major catalyst to the improved financial result in 2007/2008 and is predominantly due to a significant influx of funds from non-corporate sponsors. Overall, sponsorship has doubled this year. The Treasurer would like to acknowledge the efforts of Domenic Perrone. Dom put in an outstanding effort.

Given that sponsorship is an integral part of the club's revenue, the Treasury committee in consultation with the Executive committee will maintain and endeavour to improve this result in the 2008/2009 year.

Catering

An increase of 25% was achieved this year due to a very good year for the canteen which returned a profit of \$10,675 (up from \$8,513 last year). This was due to a full time manager being appointed for the canteen as well as AusKick and VAFA finals being held at Gillon Oval. It is imperative that the club continues to seek finals games to be held at Gillon Oval to improve on this years result.

Although the bar returned a positive result in 2007/2008 this is an area that has the potential to produce further income. The Treasury committee in consultation with Peter Hevey will conduct a review of the current pricing and will also consult the Executive/Social committee in relation to encouraging players to attend Thursday night dinners, stay back after home games and attend clubhouse based social functions.

Fundraising

Fundraising events contributed just below 1/3 of the club's revenue. In 2007/2008 income from fundraising increased by 21%, however given the significant influence this income has on the overall position of the club and the potential for future growth we must strive to increase this figure.

In 2008/2009 the Treasury committee will be working closely with the Social committee to assist in achieving the budgeted target of \$50,000 (an increase of 50% on this year's figure). A full cost analysis of each event will be performed prior to announcement to ensure the appropriate margins are maintained.

Clothing

The clothing division of this year's Profit and Loss was the worst performing area. This is mainly due to players not paying for apparel supplied to them throughout the year. Although it is not envisaged that this will be a major revenue contributor for the club we must ensure that the break-even point is reached at minimum.

To counter this problem and to ensure that this division does not cost money, measures must be put in place to ensure players pay for all apparel supplied. The Treasury committee will work with those charged with responsibility over distributing apparel in relation to this and regular stocktaking will be done to ensure all items of apparel are accounted for.

Personnel

Expenditure in relation to personnel increased by 85% this year. This is in line with the various improvements made to the club in the 2007/2008 year but still needs to be monitored so that excess expenditure is not incurred.

Playing

Playing related expenditure has increased in line with expectations in 2007/2008. It is expected that this area will continue to grow in 2008/2009 to further enhance the on field performance of the club.

Administration

Similarly to the personnel expenditure trend, administration expenses have risen by 70% in 2007/2008.

- Bank charges increased significantly due to a rise in on-line transactions which attract a percentage charge;
- General club administration rose by approximately \$2,000; and
- Trophies/awards also rose by approximately \$2,000

Although these expenses have increased, they are not considered significant to the overall position of the club. It is expected that they increase in line with growing membership, new operations, etc.

Net Assets

Refer to the Statement of Financial Position (attached) for further details.

Looking Forward

As mentioned above the major focus areas for the Treasury committee this year will be the following:-

- collection of memberships
- improving major function organization, i.e. full costing of all functions before they are undertaken, promotion of major functions, etc.
- review bar pricing to improve current margin
- consult Executive Committee in relation to increasing sponsorship
- put systems in place to ensure all apparel stock is accounted for
