## 1. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In a break with tradition I present this report in the form of a report which identifies our experience over the past football season, while identifying a number of issues that need to be addressed in 2010 and beyond.

### 1.1 Season 2009

With the completion of pre-season and the addition of 55 new players to the list confidence was very high at the commencement of the 2009 season. Terry Scanlon continued as Senior Coach along with Matt Keown as assistant. With the loss of three on ball players from last year, but with the retention of all other senior players the expectation was for an improvement in the form of the senior playing group and "go the next step" and improve on 2008 3<sup>rd</sup> finishing position.

With the reserves list in tact and only a couple of retirees there was confidence that the reserves could win back to back premierships, with John Rush being reappointed as Reserves and Senior assistant coach, assisted by Josh & Pat Buckley and John Murphy.

From an U19 perspective, of the 55 new players most were ineligible and this resulted in the Club entering a second Club18 side in Division 2 of this competition. This side were known as the "Shamrocks". This side consisted of last years U19's plus additional players all around the 19-22 age group coached by former senior player Sam Cheshire with Team Manager Gerard Joss. Greg Barry returned to coach Club 8 (4ths) and were known as the "Gryphon's" with the expectation that this side could better the 3<sup>rd</sup> position of 2008.

The addition of a further 10 sides into Club 18 saw the VAFA expand this competition into 4 divisions. This trend proved popular with a number of Clubs using Club18 as a grooming vehicle for younger players ineligible to play U19's. It is note worthy that for season 2010 the VAFA are now proposing that a "thirds" competition be introduced for A section Clubs, which essentially is about extending the Club 18 concept into a "better reserves" competition. It is proposed that this structure will then be later extended into the other Sections in successive years.

At a committee level we welcomed new members Myles Tehan as Secretary and Brad Watt. Brad's experience and involvement in the Sporting Shooters Association has enabled the preparation of applications for grants from both federal and state governments.

### Support staff

The support staff and coaches of 2008 returned with.

- John Noonan (ruck),
- Paul Kearney (forward),
- Steve Hibbert (on ball),

- Mark Hannebery and
- Trevor Fell as Chairman of Selectors

The coaching panel was also augmented with fitness coach Brendan O'Sullivan with preseason training commencing in early November at the Hockey Centre twice weekly with the continuation of last years "Boot Camp" sessions being conducted by "Paramount Fitness" on weekends. Attendance at all sessions were excellent with player participation ranging between 30-40 players per session.

Peter Clancy and John Laidlaw also returned with "BJ" becoming Team Manager for the reserves.

All of these people made large contributions in terms of time, organization and management to ensure that each player and all sides enjoyed a "seamless transition" in attending training and game days. The Club is indeed fortunate that these people offered their time without reward.

The Club was also fortunate in retaining all of last years training staff consisting of:

- John Nicolosi
- Catherine James
- Katherine Clarke
- Meagan Williams
- Liz Hibbert

All of these trainers are qualified (or nearing completion) and have been excellent in providing expertise in this area. Their commitment has enabled all training sessions to be completed with these staff (rostered) in addition to being available for each of the four teams at every game.

This range of support staff, fitness, venues, and specialist coaches reinforces the professional approach that the Club has adopted over the past 2 seasons. It however places a large commitment on finding revenue streams in order to address these issues. Really VAFA football now is only amateur in name and rules; the expectation from players in today's terms is that they expect a similar regime and professional approach similar to teams within the AFL/VFL competitions.

## **1.2 Home and away**

With a win of the first game of the season it looked like a continuation of where we let off in 2008. However this confidence was shattered with the next 5 losses at the senior level, with new comers Rupertswood (C) and Werribee (D2) to section D1 being the league leaders throughout 2009. Fifty one (51) players were used throughout the season which is probably 15 more than most senior coaches would like to use. Further 24 of these were new to the club.

New players made their way into the seniors from both reserves and Club 18 levels, with elevation and demotion "pressure" ensuring players had to perform. The observation about

our competitiveness with the league leaders and the other sides within the four came down to skill level, with the lack of ability to control and retain possession, through accurate disposal to position.

Although the reserves at the start of the year had the same list, this had changed by the first game with nine (9) new players taking to the field. Their form throughout 2009 was excellent finishing second and then winning the second semi final and then the premiership. A total of 65 players were used throughout the season, with 34 being new to the club which is extraordinary number to have played in this side. For this side to then gone onto to win the Premiership is even a greater achievement. This effort is testament to John Rush and his assistant coaches of Josh and Pat Buckley.

The Shamrocks at the commencement of the season had a very skillful and competitive side and although lighter in body had excellent skills set to push sides throughout 2009. Unfortunately this side was regularly pillaged to provide players to both senior and reserves sides with 22 players playing in the higher grades. This became problematic from a coaching and team perspective, however it enabled these players to gain valuable experience at this higher level, with a number of players going on to make selection for the Reserves Grand Final side.

The Gryphon's having enjoyed success in 2008 were disappointed to only win 2 games for the season, with 32 players contributing throughout the year. Again players were able to be promoted through to senior levels and players returning from injury were also able to get valuable game time prior to commencing with the reserves or senior sides.

As a club we are fortunate to be able to field 4 teams and accommodate in excess of 120 players; however this is not without problems and restricting full game drills to one end of the oval. This is to be addressed in 2010 with access to Raeburn Reserve to share the load and to increase the area available for training.

### **1.3 Coaches 2009**

In taking over the senior coaching position in 2008 Terry Scanlon gave himself 2 years in which to prepare the club for promotion. The time and effort that has gone into this position, over the past 2 years has been nothing short of extraordinary and this Club is very fortunate in having some one with the passion endeavor, and belief in this Club. Terry has been appointed as director of coaching/recruiting with the emphasis on improving our management of both players and coaches, given that we now have 4 teams and in excess of 100 players to oversee. This position is also responsible for recruiting and liaison with St.Patrick's Senior Coach Howard Clarke in targeting prospective players.

In terms of the senior replacement the Club was unable to accommodate Reserve Coach John Rush in terms of his expectations for season 2010. In terms of his abilities John has indeed demonstrated his coaching ability through the winning of two premierships "back to back" and the Club wish's John all the best in his future coaching ambitions.

Sam Cheshire after this season has retired from coaching duties and the Club wishes Sam all the best over the coming years.

Greg Barry who has led the Gryphon's for the past 2 seasons has also retired and although disappointed in the results for 2009 enjoyed the success of 2008 and the camaraderie of coaching the players at this level. Greg and his partner Mal welcomed into their life Xavier Barry in September, so duties on weekends will no doubt change for ever.

#### **1.4 Brunswick Junior Football Club**

In terms of the establishment of a junior football Club, a committee consisting of Tim Purdey, Steven Milne (Auskick Coordinator), Hamish McKinnon and Trevor Ludeman met with the YJFL officials in late 2008 and were successful in gaining entry into this league.

This initiative was designed to enable an outlet for the 210 AusKick children that currently use the Gillon Oval on a Saturday morning to progress into junior football with the Club. The "Brunswick Junior Football Club was incorporated and a new jumper designed. Advertisements were placed in all of the local state schools newsletters during February and March followed by letters to 100 Auskick parents. Telephone contact was also made to selected parents.

Unfortunately from the 40 eligible or U10 most ended up either not playing to being recruited to West Coburg. As such we were unable to enter a side for season 2009.

This initiative however is to be progressed for season 2010 with expressions of interest again being mailed out to Auskick families in November. **I have also received an expression from junior players seeking to play U17 (Colts in the YJFL) which is currently being explored.**

From a broader perspective, it is no coincidence that the this years Grand Finalists of Rupertswood and Fitzroy all have extensive junior football clubs which assist in the transition of juniors to U18/19 levels and then onto senior football. Both of these clubs have in excess of 300-400 juniors, whilst both have 2 x U19 sides. Examination of VAFA clubs in the higher divisions also reveals either junior teams or alliances with district junior football clubs to assist in player transition to higher levels.

From a NOBSPC perspective junior development is required given our circumstances, in that we are not a "district club", with the school alliance from St. Josephs only resulting in only four (4) players over the past decade.

The alliance with St. Patrick's Ballarat in 2005 has started to now gain momentum (12 players over 2006-09) but will always be tempered by the issue of availability of students seeking tertiary education in Melbourne. This will transition will be impacted by federal government policy with a high proportion of country students taking gap years in order to gain access to the AusStudy allowance. This issue to be partly addressed with the establishment of the COBS foundation (see below).

## 1.5 Clubs Online

At present we have in excess of 510 members on email, with less than 30 members still on postal. This system enables the Club to provide short match reports (prepared by Team Managers) of each Saturdays results to all members by email on Monday. On Friday each member was reminded on the time and venue for each game. This effort was coordinated and completed by Tim Waters who is based in Sydney.

Many members have commented that this was a great way to keep in contact with the fortunes of the respective sides and also enabled them to plan for upcoming games or events. We are indebted to Tony Duggan for use of this management system.

## 1.6 Social events

The success on field also resulted in success off field with in excess of 700 people attending the following events:

- Levenson – first game function - 70
- Ladies Day – 85
- Crown Casino Coterie luncheon – 90
- Auction Night – 220
- President's luncheons (Premiership reunions for 1994 Reserves and 1976) – 100
- Presentation Night – 130
- Scanlon Testimonial dinner - 103

The attendance by supporters during home games was very good and our engagement with past players and supporters continued. The Club was also fortunate to have former administrators and special guest speakers Paul Lavaca (County Court Judge) and Paul Coghlan (Supreme Court Judge) at one of luncheons.

However with the exception of the San Remo event, most functions made little profit. The 5K draw was postponed this year given the proximity to both the San Remo Ball/Auction night and proximity to finals, with members and players experiencing fatigue in contributing further to another event.

The social calendar was set well in advance of season 2009 with respective committees and the club is indebted to the efforts of Social Committee Chairman Scott Sleep, Brendan Sheehan, Adam Crameri and Simon Harwood. Scott Sleep had been a tireless coordinator now for at least a decade in this position and he is to be commended for the completion of these duties throughout this period.

From a social perspective our calendar is comprehensive and caters for a wide range of events for most members, with daytime events (Coterie luncheon, President's luncheons) suiting the older members and evening events for the players and "younger" supporters.



What the financial results reveal is that with the exception of the major San Remo event, most functions generate little profit for the Club. This then poses the next question about whether the social mix is correct and priced accordingly. We constantly run into the view that we cannot price such events at the high end, lest we forgo patronage.

At the end of the day the cost of running the club for 2009 was \$160,000 representing \$1300 per player.

So we need better input from the players, partners and supporters about what mix and pricing of events needs to be considered and how we can encourage people from outside the Club to attend and generate improved financial outcomes.

## 1.7 Finance 2009

Brendan Sheehan completed the task of Treasurer throughout 2006 to 2008. After this three year stint Brendan passed the duties onto Alex Kemp an accountant who played with the club in 2008. Alex unfortunately had to return to Queensland at the end of 2008, which meant the club was without a treasurer. Prior to his return Alex was able to prepare a draft budget based on the financials of 2008. This revealed a budget of \$200,000 would have to be achieved for 2009.

The task of treasurer was taken over by Wendy Canobie. The main focus, given this expected budget, was to introduce:

- Improved financial reporting mechanisms to the Committee;
- Adopt the VAFA chart of accounts;
- Pre-approval of purchases and reduce contra payments;
- Improve stock control;
- Improve wage control and reporting;
- Reduce cash payments from the "till";
- Register for GST.

This approach was also reinforced by the VAFA when prior to the commencement of this season a presentation to all treasurers was undertaken by a Treasurer of one of the VAFA Clubs. The context of this presentation was presented as follows, "*as an accountant can you take a look at our present position, we think we are \$30,000 in the red*". It took two weeks to finalise the overall financial position where it was discovered the debt was actually \$60,000. Five years later the club has eradicated this debt and is now in the positive in the order of \$15,000. This presentation focused on introducing financial control, putting systems in place etc. This approach however had come at the cost to his business (time) of approximately \$8000 p.a.

For 2009 this same approach was undertaken with a number of improvements that were implemented to gain a better understanding of financial control and to actually impose a level of financial control. The club accounts were placed onto a MYOB platform which substantially improved financial control and reporting. This improved control however comes at a "notional" labour cost of 2 days per week in terms of banking, reconciliation, payments and invoicing etc.

## 1.8 Sponsorship & membership

One of the main challenges that faced most Clubs prior to 2009 was the unknown impact the global financial crisis would no doubt play in terms of sponsorship. In response to this issue sponsorship packages were not increased. However sponsorship declined with a reduction of 40% from 2008.

In terms of player memberships these were increased to more realistic levels, which were designed to cover for the major expenses such as medical supplies, trainers, coaching fees etc. The fees adopted were \$250 for Club 18 (shorter season) and \$300 for senior/reserves. This was up from \$165 (U19), \$10 a game Club 18, and \$250 (seniors/reserves).

To give some context on this issue, junior soccer/basketball fees across the metropolitan area are in the order of \$300-450 per child per season, with the "on costs" no where near those generated by AFL football.

The increase in fees was also accompanied with the adoption of a new rule that all players had to have commenced payment of memberships by the commencement of the season and completed by the end of May. Approximately 50% of the playing group had complied with this rule by the 31 May. For those players, where payments posed some difficulty arrangements were put in place to collect on a weekly/monthly basis. Fitzroy F.C. imposed similar controls, albeit tighter with all players having to have paid memberships by the end of April.

In past years the collection of player memberships has been problematic and the lack of collection and players taking responsibility has resulted insufficient funds being collected. This lack of attention in past years has come back to haunt us. This year the approach was different with payments collected at each training session. The use of the mobile EFTPOS machine also made this task substantially easier. This partly explains the large differential in the collection of memberships in 2009 as compared to previous years.

In terms of stock control, "a shop" was set up each Thursday night or players to collect and pay for shorts, socks jumpers etc. This resulted in playing attire being paid and accounted for.

As identified above, we are not a district club but not necessarily a school club where parents, supporters are close at hand to lend a hand. The lack of parental involvement has consequences in terms of the costs associated with running the club, with many functions (scoreboard, time keepers, canteen, trainers) all paid positions.

From a facility perspective we also do not have access to a subsidized ground, with ground costs in the order of \$15,000 p.a.

## **1.9 COBs Foundation**

This initiative has been driven by Lee Iafrate. Lee became our first St. Pats sponsor (Major) in 2008. A committee consisting of Terry Scanlon, Bernie Skahill, Trevor Ludeman, Denis Churkovich, Lee Iafrate and Mark Waddington (St. Pats Development officer) have been meeting regularly over the past 12 months. The concept behind a Foundation is to be providing an avenue of support to future players through a scholarship program to assist students from St. Pats in seeking to study in Melbourne. Most of the private schools have foundations for both scholarships, building funds etc, with funds generated through donations that are tax deductible.

The idea behind the initiative is to complement and extend the existing St Pat's Foundation to assist students beyond year 12. One of the major issues impacting on tertiary students from regional areas is the cost of tertiary or vocational studies. An increasingly common way to approach this issue is for students to take a "gap year" and earn a minimum of \$18,000 over this 12 month period and then enrol. The completion of the gap year then classifies the student as independent, meaning their parents income is not means tested for Austudy purposes. This has ramifications for recruitment of students to the Club from St. Patrick's College.

It is expected that the first social function to start fund raising for the COB foundation will take place in early 2010 and will be along the lines of a coterie luncheon with AFL guest speakers.

## **1.10 Water**

The Gillon oval was not watered this year by the Moreland City Council. This was confirmed in March when the ground was clearly dead and the grass worn out through pre-season training and cricket. The Council in March had expended 60 of the 65 mega litre water right, however Gillon Oval was not one of the grounds to be maintained throughout the summer. This was an odd approach, given the ground had been over sown in late November and with the three inches of rain in early December had resulted in an excellent grass cover. This cover was unable to be maintained.

Throughout March to June \$16,000 of water was purchased by Terry Scanlon, which was able to keep some of the oval "alive" but in hindsight this level of water application was probably only half (50,000 litres per week) of what should have been applied.

This has obvious consequences for the use of the oval or both cricket and football. For this year the same approach will apply in that it will not be watered. This is considered to be an unusual approach, given the 2007 installation of 125,000 litre tank designed for this purpose, where "A class" water can be purchased and applied to the ground. The cost of transporting this water to Brunswick is \$400 per 40,000 litres or \$10,000 per megalitre, which is expensive, given the level of water required to maintain an oval.

I have investigated the costing of installing a bore, which is as follows:

- The application fee for a bore from Southern Rural Water is \$1550 with an annual fee of \$275 for 3 megalitres of water per annum.
- Installation of a bore would be around \$12-13,000.
- The water within the aquifer below Brunswick however is saline and would need treatment through a desalinisation plant which would cost in the order of \$25,000.
- Pump \$5000.

Sportsgrass Pty Ltd (Jim Marchbank) have advised that to keep the oval in reasonable shape leading up to April, an application rate of 250,000 litres per week from February onwards would need to be adopted. This would require pumping from the aquifer on 24/7 basis and could be achieved, given that the yield within this aquifer is 1 litre per second.

It is obvious that these costs are outside the clubs capability, however the issue of grants from the State government for such works needs to be investigated in conjunction with the Moreland Council and the Brunswick Cricket Club and Cricket Victoria. I am seeking a meeting with Moreland City Council on this issue.

The expected upgrade of the “surrounds” to the Gillon Oval over 2009/2010 is to involve the sealing of the car park, two new tennis courts, additional practice wicket, new access, removal of earth bunds and installation of new fencing etc. It is considered that this cost (\$50,000) to provide the oval with a limitless supply of water is not significant when compared to the projected costs of the proposed works to the areas outside of the playing surface. All of these works will be pointless should the playing surface be lost or degraded to an extent where the use of the oval is restricted from use for both cricket and football clubs.

### **1.11 Sponsors 2010**

Lee Iafrate (Armytage Pty Ltd) will be the jumper sponsor for 2010-2012 contributing \$15,000 over this period. This will purchase new jumpers for the senior/reserves teams with the company name located underneath the number. A revision of the colors has been made with the St.Patrick's blue and green being closer to the school colors, with a reduction in the width of the white strip at the front and its deletion from the back of the jumper. The purple of St Josephs remains unchanged. This jumper design (see WEB) has been approved by the VAFA for season 2010.

Patties Foods Ltd will also be shorts and socks sponsors over this period contributing \$2000 p.a. towards the purchase of new attire with the Four'n Twenty logo attached to the front of the shorts.

### **1.12 Coterie Group**

Dom Perrone our sponsorship manager is seeking to establish a Coterie group to assist with the long term strategic planning and financial management. In comparison with other VAFA clubs we need to improve our supporter and sponsorship levels.

Examination of other VAFA club reveals our sponsorships levels to be substantially lower to the level of \$20-30,000. Another VAFA club encourages older members to contribute via automatic deduction with this club now having in excess of \$200,000 in the bank.

Obviously this level of funding cannot be gained just from members contributing a "membership" fee. Their needs to be more work completed on attracting and approaching sponsors from surrounding businesses, entrepreneurs and St.Pats Old Collegians.

These will be one of the many issues of the Coterie Group to address. Dom is looking for those interested in assisting with this task.

### **1.13 Conclusion**

The review of 2007 identified the *pieces of the jigsaw* that needed to be resolved to make the Club more competitive. The resolution of these issues and implementation of new initiatives combined with the effort by all players, coaches, members, sponsors resulted in a far more successful and competitive year for season 2008 and again for 2009, resulting in two reserves premierships.

The challenges outlined above are many and there are a number of long term issues that need to be resolved. It anticipated this Annual report will generate positive discussion into how these issue can be resolved, so that both on and off field competitiveness are improved over the coming 3-5 years.

## 2. TREASURER'S REPORT – SEASON 2009

On behalf of the Committee of NOBSPC, the financial report for Season 2009 is presented to the members for your consideration and approval.

### 2.1 Introduction

At the beginning of the clubs financial year (1st October 2008) the Club owed various known Creditors the amount of \$25,000.00 (long-term) plus Other Creditors of \$15000.06 as per last year's Balance Sheet. The Creditors of \$15000.06 consisted:

- VAFA \$6299.00
- Ascot Vale Trophies \$2065.95
- Medical Equip. Services \$6127.01
- Moreland Council \$470.00
- Unknown \$38.10

This amount was significant given that the funds in the bank were not sufficient to cover for this level of debt. Some players paid their memberships throughout this period to assist in cash flow, although the amount received was not enough to cover this amount. This level of debt placed severe financial constraints on the conduct of operations throughout the early part of the season.

This issue was further compounded when further outstanding invoices totalling \$8765.66 for Season 2008 were presented and consisted of:

- BBQ Bloke \$1485 (2008 \$5K Draw)
- BBQ Bloke \$2002 (2008 Presentation Night)
- Flower Shop \$330 (2008 Presentation Night)
- Liquor License \$58 (2008 Presentation Night)
- Inge Detective Agency \$836.55 (2008 Presentation Night)
- SportsForce \$835.56 (Footballs, drink bottles & carriers 2008)
- Concept Data \$805.20 (2008 Premier Polo's)
- Brunswick Cricket Club \$1046 (Telephone & Electricity)
- TRU Energy Gas \$362
- SupaTurf \$154 (paint for Line Marking)
- Yarra Valley Water \$275.85 (June-Sept2008)
- Eamon McColl \$575.50 (physio hours & sports medicine course Aug08)

All of these debts have been paid, however this level of money should have been used to reduce the level of long term debt owed by the Club. This amount has now been deferred for two years and cannot be prolonged any further. It was anticipated that half would be paid off this year in lieu of the senior coaching duties, given that this has been completed at pro bono over 2008-09. This debt needs to be paid off over the next two financial years in \$12,500 increments.

A summary of the Clubs financial position is:

- Creditors at year end 30/9/2009 are \$25,000 (long-term) and \$5105.69 (Moreland City Council) – paid \$1000 towards the rent on 29/10/09;
- The closing Bank Account balance at the end of the financial year 30/9/09 was \$7523.84;
- Of this balance, prepayments of \$3705 is attributed to the T. Scanlon Testimonial Dinner held on 2/10/09;
- The Bank Account balance as at **30th October 2009 is \$1125.55;**
- Debtors owing \$2650 – The Leveson \$1650 & St. Patrick’s Old Collegians \$1000.

## 2.2 Summary

This year was quite difficult to manage in terms of the payments of the numerous invoices and creditors, given that some \$24,000 was found owing after the end of the 2008 financial year. Given this issue all purchases had to be approved by the treasurer, and at times this resulted in some stock such as new footballs and medical supplies being denied, whilst wages were paid monthly. Procedures for bar and canteen floats, payments to umpires and other assistance were refined and put in place to eliminate payments from the till and to account for all monies.

Although the \$200,000 budget estimate thankfully did not materialize, the adoption of MYOB and the centralization of payments through the Treasurer have resulted in a far more accurate recording of all financial data. This will now make budgeting and forecasting more accurate and also enable accurate estimates to be made of fees and charges to be levied by the Club each year.

This lack of accuracy and rigor in financial control however has cost the club financially, given that memberships, fees and charges have never been set accurately to recover the expected costs. Further at the end of the financial year we are left with little in the bank to accommodate for pre-season training and expenses that will be incurred in the early part of 2010.

## 2.4 Fund Raising

Fund raising via social events is one of the major sources of income, with the Auction night at the San Remo ballroom being the major event for the year. As the table shows all other events made little profit, whilst the 5K draw was not held this year.

The biggest increase in this revenue stream was that of player memberships, and this was covered in Section 1.8.



Apparel sales were also significant given that a “shop” was run to ensure all players paid for shorts, socks etc. The reason for the difference of \$2325 however is due to an excess of stock being ordered which we still have, albeit somewhat reduced. There are also 35 polo shirts prepared in response to the Reserves winning the 2008 Grand Final that have not been collected or paid for by players. However, these shirts can be still purchased next season. Other stock on hand includes 18 Stadium Jackets.

Sponsorships, although held at last years levels and benefits declined from \$37,450 to \$21,568, representing a 42% reduction, no doubt due to the uncertainty at the start of the year in response to the Global Financial Crisis (GFC).

Canteen profit was slightly up from \$10,675 to \$11,948 with a large part of this due to the finals campaigns conducted at the Gillon Oval during late August by the VAFA. We hope next year to improve this financial income with the appointment of Linda Minenko whose experience in catering will assist in expanding the range of food types and products to be offered from the canteen.

Thursday night meals were largely purchased this year from a supplier, however, a minimum order of 40 meals at \$8.00 each made any profits problematic during the middle part of the year (mid term break) and player numbers were down. We hope to complete this service in house for 2010.

Raffles on Saturday could be profitable with most being put together for \$50.00 and raffled for between \$200-250. The secondment of reserve players to complete this duty however also became a problem, even though it only had to be completed between half time and the end of the senior game and only involved 9 home games. It was only completed on 4 occasions. This is to be addressed next year through the nomination of those responsible on Thursday night at team selection. The balance of the money raised by raffles was through the Thursday night “joker raffle”, although some of this money was used to part pay the supplier of Thursday night meals.

Bar profit was up from \$3609 in 2008 to \$9220 in 2009. This was a result of club social functions held at the clubrooms with good attendances, players & supporters staying on after games. The bar was also opened for social games (‘The Tote Hotel’ and local primary school) and three VAFA weekends of “finals” games.

The above costs do not include the payment of the Senior coach throughout this year, which needs to be accommodated within the 2010 budget.

The VAFA expenses are enormous given what you receive. The Club was charged \$2297 for the Football Record which players and supporters hardly ever read.

Match reviews and previews are limited to 2 paragraphs, whilst competition ladders, statistics etc. are now covered on the VAFA web site.

Players Equipment, drinks etc. are those offered during pre-season (Gatorade, soft drink, lollies, footballs, drink bottles) and throughout the season. Equipment other included \$2202 for a new net located at the western end of the Gillon Oval.

Ground expenses of \$7624 are also significant in terms of electricity, water and gas. The invoices for some of these Services are directed to the Brunswick Cricket Club of which they would pay and then forward to us for reimbursement. As a result of this, old accounts of \$1322 for 2008 were forwarded to the club well into the 2009 season. After discussions with the BCC treasurer, I requested that all future invoices applicable to the football club be sent to us to pay the supplier directly and vice-versa.

Medical supplies were substantially down on last year's \$10,000. This was a result of surplus supplies of stock ordered towards the end of season 2008. Again improved stock control ensured supplies were only ordered when required and approved.

General expenses mainly consisted of bank charges, merchant fees (eftpos machine), Clubs On-line charges, trophies, depreciation, insurance, printing, postage and cleaning.

## **2.7 GST Registration**

Due to the Club's 2008 annual turnover being greater than \$150,000 (non-profit organization) it was a requirement of the Club to register for GST with the Australian Taxation Office. The Club was officially registered on 1st April, 2009. The Club is to submit quarterly GST statements declaring all GST paid and collected each quarter. This is a simple process as the computerized accounting system used this year can produce the required information and reports.

The Australian Taxation Office states:

*"If your non-profit organization is registered (or required to be registered) for GST, the money raised from fundraising activities will be subject to GST unless the funds are a genuine gift to your organization."*

## **2.8 Accounting Software**

This year the Club's financial information was entered into a computerised accounting system called MYOB. This task took many hours to set up all the required accounts and trace all monies owing to numerous creditors as well as reconciling all bank transactions since 30th September, 2008. The benefits of the system allow for better financial reporting and more informative and detailed reports. As every sale and purchase is recorded this creates better internal control of funds and analysis of costs for future budgeting etc. this enabled monthly financial reports to be prepared and circulated to the Committee.

## **2.9 Cash Payments**

The process this year for cash payments was changed to better control the flow of cash and keep better account of monies spent etc. The payments to support staff, physios, trainers, canteen staff, reimbursements for "approved" purchases, payment of creditors, etc. were done by inter-bank transfer mostly at end of each month and all recorded into the system.

A Debit Card for purchases was obtained and will be kept by the purchasing officer only. This was issued to eliminate the purchasing of goods for the Club using personal funds and/or without approval. It also cuts down on bank fees (no cheque written) and the GST component is claimed.

## **2.10 2008 Treasurer's Recommendations**

Last years Treasurer reports identified a number of recommendations to be dealt with prior to season 2008. These have been listed (*italics*) followed by a summary of what action was undertaken for 2009.

*Collection of memberships* – although we have used “Clubsonline” for the past two year and all players were made aware of this facility, just about all paid via the mobile EFTPOS machine. This facility costs \$250 to establish and a monthly fee of \$51.90, plus a percentage of takings. The machine was used for all social function and proved well worth the expense. It was available at all Thursday training sessions and Saturday games and players were regularly asked to pay. This process will be continued for season 2010. Another preferred payment method is by direct deposit using internet banking directly into the Club’s bank account.

Of the 120 players there are probably 20 (inc those retired) who have not paid the full amount. The VAFA rules allow for the refusal of clearance for those that owe \$150 or more. Any players seeking clearances will not be cleared. Those who still have monies outstanding from 2009 will also be required to pay prior to 2010.

*Fundraising* – The objective this year was to achieve a budget of \$50,000, which would have represented a 50% increase. Season 2008 figures for social events reveal a turn over of \$72,200, expenses of \$42,452 with a profit of \$29,748, which is substantially higher than 2009. The social event calendar was developed in the early part of the season to ensure all players and supporters knew of the dates for each event. Some slippage occurred with the delay of events in the early and mid part of the year, with the result of the cancellation of the 5K draw. Nonetheless the review of the Auction night and adoption of music and dance improved attendances with an increase from 180 (2008) to 220 (2009).

*Clothing* – the objective was to improve stock control and ensure players paid for clothing/apparel, given this was the worst performing area of the Club in 2008. This situation was improved with the creation of the “shop” on a Thursday night and will continue for 2010. In terms of stock control, orders for new stock will be reduced in line with existing levels.

## **2.11 Budget 2010**

Given the above reports generated by MYOB it is now up to the Committee to prepare a Budget for 2010. This will require a review of all expenditure, memberships and charges and repayment of debtors.

In terms of fund raising the main issue will be about attracting more people from outside the club to social events and to be sponsors for 2010. This task should be examined by the Coterie Group as proposed in Section 1.12
